Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium funding is additional funding which the school receives for each eligible pupil and allows us best support the children both academically and across the wider school curriculum e.g. trips and residentials.

Your child may be eligible for free school meals and pupil premium funding if you are in receipt of one or more of these benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

Please note that **all** reception and key stage 1 children are entitled to a free school meal **but** the school will not receive any additional funding if an application is not made.

Thank you for your continued patience and understanding with regard to the use of the car park – it feels like it is generally working well. If you can use it then please do. The ultimate aim of using this is to remove as much traffic from Church Hill as possible and thus making it safer for our children, moving them away from what can be a very busy road at times. Reminders:

- In the mornings and at the end of the day, all of the gates around the school will be open. We would ask that when parking in the car park that you enter and exit by the rear of the school, in order to avoid walking against the flow of traffic.
- When parking please aim to have the middle of your car in line with the double yellow markings on the stones. This will maximise space.
- Walk down the path to the left of the railings.
- Currently, we are asking that only KS2 children use the drop off option. If you have KS1 children then please park and walk the children to their classroom. In a few weeks we will evaluate this and look at the possibility of extending the drop off for KS1 children.
- Please ensure that you are being respectful of our local residents and neighbours and avoid blocking driveways.
