Nasal Flu Vaccinations – Wednesday 13th October - ACTION NEEDED

Yesterday we emailed a letter about nasal flu vaccinations. Kernow Health are delivering the flu immunisation programme in Cornwall's schools on behalf of NHS England. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu.



In 2021/2022 all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please enter https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/child-flu-vaccine/ to access information explaining the vaccination programme which also includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate.



If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated.


