







Dear parents and carers,

A shorter week this week which has been a treat but already this summer term is racing by. We have lots to look forward including our Y6 residential, Y3&Y4 class assemblies (dates to be confirmed soon), Y5 & Y6 end of year shows, a Jubilee celebration, sports days and much more. This week we have started to have a more focused look at maths teaching in our school, which forms part of school development work over the summer term. It was a privilege to join both Red Oaks and then Bur Oaks this week to be part of their maths lessons and learning – I was really impressed by their attitudes and of course their mathematics. Over the next couple of weeks, I will be visiting more lessons and talking to more children about their learning, which I am really looking forward to. Other highlights this week include:

- Acorns have had a fantastic week learning all about dinosaurs. The children have been excellent resourceful learners and sourced their own information about dinosaurs through looking at books and going on dinosaur hunts. They have created a giant dinosaur fact file to show their understanding of dinosaurs before making fossils.
- Seedlings have been very excited to see that the potatoes that they planted last half term are now growing. Thank you, Angie, (parish council).
- Buds have been learning all about cheetahs in English. They have written detailed sentences which include adjectives and time adverbials to describe the savannah.





- Young Oaks great grammar this week. Exploring subordinating conjunctions!
- Bur Oaks have had a great start to the summer. They now know, a mountain is a landform that sticks up, high above the surrounding land. It is much taller than a hill (600 metres or above, in the UK). Sadly, there are no mountains in Cornwall but lots of hills!
- Red Oaks have been learning all about Going Global, focusing on 'how trade became global' and 'which countries source the food we buy in a supermarket'.
- Mighty Oaks took their SATS revision outside in the sunshine for a treasure hunt. It was
 wonderful to see the children putting their skills to the test whilst running around looking for
 clues.







Next week the Mighty Oaks do have their SATs tests from Monday through to Thursday and we wish them the very best of luck for these, we are very proud of them.

COVID Vaccinations

Vaccination Clinics have been selected by the NHS to administer vaccinations to young people throughout Cornwall.

1st and 2nd doses are currently being administered to children aged 5-15, and teenagers aged between 15 & 17 can also book their 1st, 2nd and Booster doses.

COVID

From 1st April the guidance surrounding COVID-19 changed. There is no longer an expectation that children are tested and free tests are no longer available. Children and young people who are unwell and have <u>a high temperature</u> should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults. Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.
