History Day – Advance Notice – 10th November

To celebrate our half termly History focus we will be having a whole day focused on the subject. As part of this day we are inviting children to dress up as something from the period they will be learning about:

- Acorns their favourite memory. This could be the outfit they wore on that day or something that reminds them of that favourite memory (this links to their learning of memories within their living memory)
- Seedlings a person from a previous generation in living memory (we will be learning about how toys and books have changed over the years)

You can now apply for your September 2026 place so it is the perfect time to book onto one of our open mornings and see what we have to offer here at Chacewater School.


Securing the right school place for your child is an important step for all parents and carers. This is why it's crucial to get the right information early on and submit your application before the deadline.


