People in Kenya have been given a day's holiday to help plant 100 million trees. The event is part of a bigger goal to plant 15 billion trees in 10 years to help fight climate change. The government said it will provide free tree seedlings for people to plant in public areas and has encouraged people to buy seedlings to plant on their own land. The tree planting will be tracked by an app, where people can log the location and type of tree they have planted.

We will travel by coach each day and hope that parents/carers will be able contribute towards the cost of transport through ParentPay at an equivalent of £2.50 per day.

The children will need a swimming hat, goggles and a towel for these sessions.

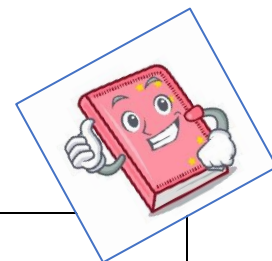
Asthma Pumps
