## Harvest



Our harvest celebration is a few weeks away but it was a real pleasure to meet with Reverend Jem this week to confirm that we will be able to take the children to the church for this. Miss Dyer has already begun working on some songs and these are sounding great. This year we will be supporting Truro Foodbank and they would, in particular, appreciate donations of goods with a long shelf life.

## Pupil Premium

**Pupil Premium funding is additional funding which the school receives for each eligible pupil and allows us best support the children both academically and across the wider school curriculum e.g. trips and residential.**

Your child may be eligible for free school meals and pupil premium funding if you are in receipt of one or more of these benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

Please note that **all** reception and key stage 1 children are entitled to a free school meal **but** the school will not receive any additional funding if an application is not made.

## Secondary School Applications



It might seem a long way off but if you have a child in year 6 then you will need to apply for a secondary school place by **31<sup>st</sup> October**. If you need any help then please do pop in and see us.

## General Reminders

- School gates will open at 8.40am in the morning and registration is at 8.55am. The school day ends at 3.15pm and we will open the gates shortly before this. There is no one way system in place for walking around the school.
- On days when the children in KS2 are timetabled for PE can they please wear their PE kit into school and **have long hair tied back**.
- Coats! Please ensure that children are bringing coats into school.
- Snack - please can children bring in a healthy snack (no nuts). For younger children **please can you ensure that tomatoes and grapes are cut up**.
- Check the class pages on the website for weekly homework.
- Mask wearing – we are moving to personal choice when outside. However, we ask that anyone who is coming into the school does wear a mask.
- **Can we respectfully ask that at the beginning and end of the day that you do not let your children play on equipment in the Early Years outside area. Often resources are set up ready for the day ahead or the next day. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.**

## Breakfast Club


